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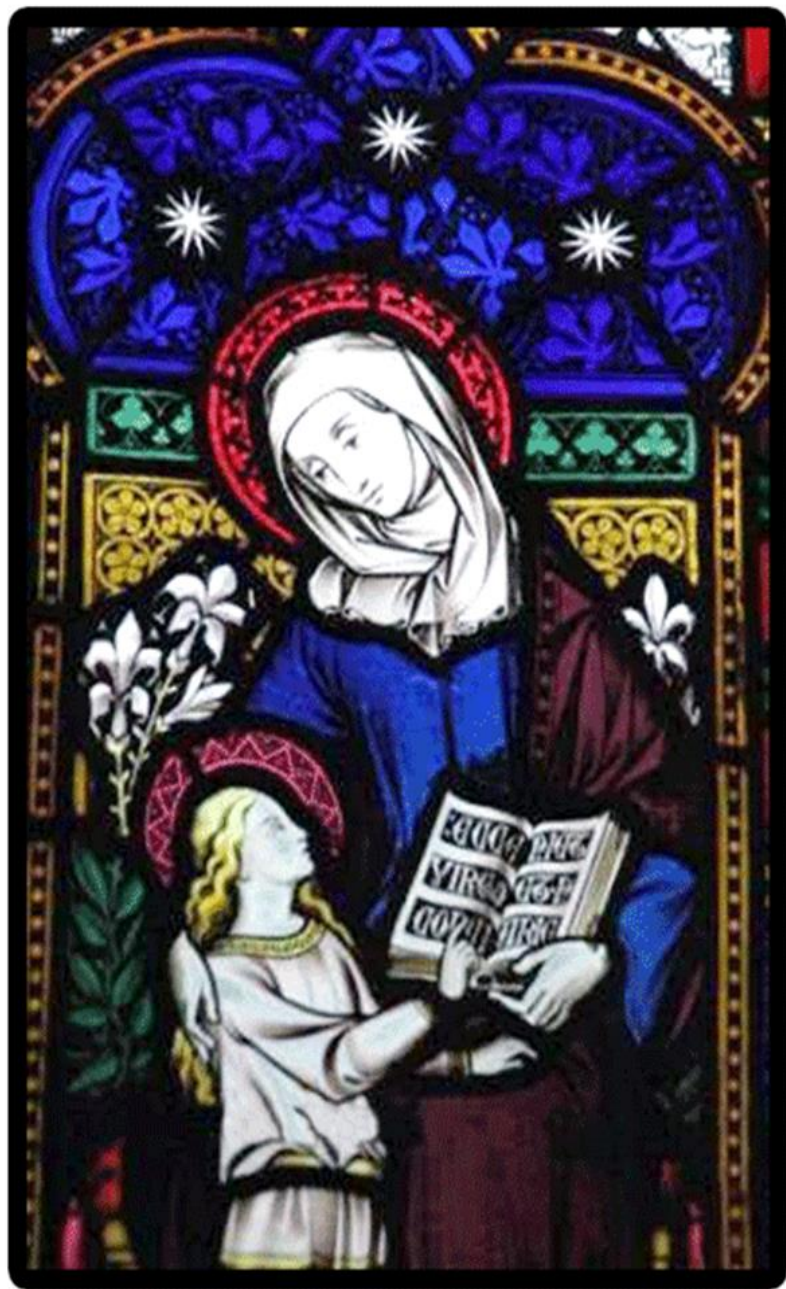
School Prayer

Course Summary:

English Literature - Love Through the Ages

There will be two exam papers:

The first involves a study of a Shakespeare play (Othello) and a poetry anthology.

The second involves the study of two prose texts and there is also a question on an unseen prose extract.

English Literature continued into Year 13 is made up of two units:

Texts in Shared Contexts - Modern Times: students will study one prose text, one drama text and one poetry text. This is assessed by an exam in which students are required to answer three questions.

Texts Across Time: Independent Critical Study – a non-exam assessment based on two texts in which students choose their texts and produce a comparative essay of 2,500 words approx.

Philosophy of Religion – Ancient philosophical influences, arguments about the existence and non-existence of God, the nature and impact of religious experience, ideas about the nature of God, the nature of soul, mind and body, ideas about life after death, the challenge to religious belief of the problem of evil.

Religion and Ethics - Major ethical theories such as Utilitarianism, Virtue Ethics, Kantian ethics; ethical theories from a religious perspective, such as Natural Law & Situation Ethics; application to ethical theories in Medical Ethics, Sexual Ethics, War & Peace; what do we mean by Free Will, Conscience, Right, Wrong.

A study of Christianity – The Christian Scriptures as a source of wisdom and authority, Religious concepts and Religious Life, significant social and historical developments in Christian thought.
