Funding

St. Anne's Catholic High School for Girls received:

£9 500 in 2015/16

£10 500 in 2014/15

£17 000 in 2013/14

The funding was deployed in the following ways:

- Lexia Reading Programme
- Teaching Assistant Support
- Numeracy Classes

Impact of the use of Year 7 Catch-up Funding

Significant progress = Students progressing to the next ARE band in an academic year.

Good progress = Students progressing within the top 2 thirds of the ARE band they are in in an academic year.

Expected progress = Students progressing in the top third of ARE band in an academic year.

18 students started Year 7 in September 2015 with their fine line Key Stage 2 Maths levels below level 4 and 8 students started Year 7 in September 2015 with their fine line Key Stage 2 English levels below level 4.

The table shows the percentage of students who made significant progress English and/or Maths, those who made expected progress or good progress in English and Maths.
