Literacy and Numeracy Catch-up Premium Statement

The Literacy and Numeracy catch-up premium provides schools with an additional finance for each Year 7 student who did not achieve at least level 4 in Reading and/or Maths at the end of Key Stage 2 (KS2) based on 2015/16 numbers; students did not receive levels in 2016 but standardised scores, students with a score of less than 100 were identified for the programme.

Funding

St. Anne's Catholic High School for Girls received:

£ 9,604 in 2016/17

£ 9,500 in 2015/16

£10,500 in 2014/15

£17,000 in 2013/14

The funding was deployed in the following ways:

- Secondary Literacy Catch up Programme
- Lexia Reading Programme
- Teaching Assistant Support
- Numeracy Classes

Impact of the use of Year 7 Catch-up Funding

- **Significant progress = Students progressing to the next ARE band in an academic year.**
- **Good progress = Students progressing within the upper 2 thirds of the ARE band they are in in an academic year.**
- **Expected progress = Students progressing in the lower third of ARE band in an academic year.**

18 students started Year 7 in September 2017 with a Key Stage 2 Maths score below 100 and 7 with a Key Stage 2 English score below 100.

The table shows the percentage of students who made significant progress, those who made expected progress or good progress in English and/or Maths.

Expected Progress	43% (3 students)	33% (6 students)
